<p>I am hearing in the "hallways" that we are supposed to be testing a version of Isis3 called isis3cnetpush.....this has confused me (which isn't hard to do), it's definitely 'my bad' if I missed an email!? I have been testing under isis3nightly, but now have heard that fixes and testing should be performed on isis3cnetpush?? (I have seen some 'qnet' emails from Tracie about isis3cnetpush, but I am not clear if this is just for qnet or all binary control apps?).</p> <p>I hoped that this would be a good place to post so that someone please clarify what the 'formal' plan is?</p> <p>Thank you much!</p>	

#### History

There has been some understandable confusion on what version of ISIS needs to be used for testing during the cnet push. To help clear this up, we are removing the "cnetpush" version of ISIS and merging all cnetpush changes into the current nightly. These changes will be available in isis3nightly2011-07-12.

To provide a fall back in case the nightly build fails we have frozen the current nightly (isis3nightly2011-07-09) and provided a link to it called isis3frozen. This version will remain available until we get the go ahead from you to remove it. This should happen when we create the next stable production version be that "Astro", "LMMP" or something else.

cnetpush testing of applications should be done using the nightly build. If you need to test the way it was before we started the push use isis3frozen. All ISIS 3 software changes from here on will be available in the next day's nightly build. No changes will be made to "isis3frozen"

Disposition of current versions of ISIS3:

isis3frozen (isis3nightly2011-07-09) - will remain as is until no longer needed  
isis3nightly2011-##-## - will continue to keep the last 21 versions  
isis3nightly2011-06-08 - will remain as is until no longer needed  
isis3cnetpush - will be deleted in the morning (7/12/11)  
isis3astro - will remain as is with required patches if required  
isis3.2.1 - will remain as is with required patches if required
